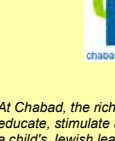

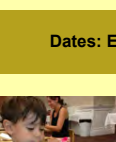

LifeTown provides life skills training for children with disabilities. We rely on volunteers to make our unique program work.

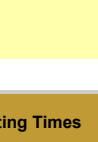
