Lag BaOmer, the 33rd day of the Omer counting, which we celebrated yesterday, is the yartzeit of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai - one of the greatest Sages of the Talmud and the author of the Zohar, the fundamental text of the Kabbalah - Jewish mysticism. Customarily, **we commemorate Lag BaOmer by outings;** taking our children out to the forests and the fields, marching in parades and celebrating outdoors.

This raises an obvious question: Is it right to honor the passing of a great scholar by dismissing our studies and going out to the fields? Rabbi Shimon was described as one who made Torah study his occupation - his entire life revolved around these teachings. Why then do we commemorate his life by taking a vacation from school? The point is that Lag BaOmer may be a vacation from school, but not a vacation from the Torah. On the contrary, the intent is to show how Rabbi Shimon's teachings give us the insight to **extend the Torah beyond the confines of the school building**. Forests and fields are not usually associated with the Jewish way of life, and yet, Rabbi Shimon provides us with the mind set to extend the Torah's wisdom into such settings.

This is dependent on Rabbi Shimon's mystic teaching. The Zohar, which he authored, gives us the conceptual underpinnings to perceive G-dliness in every environment, and to understand how every element of our existence reflects spiritual truth. So from outings to cheese cakes to Shavot ice cream parties - let's celebrate by imbuing within our great universe real spirituality.

The Torah section of Emor ("Speak") begins with the special laws pertaining to the <u>kohanim</u> ("priest"), the <u>kohen gadol</u> ("ligh priest"), and the <u>Temple service:</u> A kohen may not become ritually impure through contact with a <u>dead body</u>, save on the occasion of the death of a <u>closs</u> <u>relative</u>. A kohen may not marry a divorcee, or a woman with a promiscuous past; a <u>kohen gadol</u> can marry only a virgin. A <u>kohen</u> with a physical <u>deformity</u> cannot serve in the Holy Temple, nor can a deformed animal be brought as an offering.

Parshat Emor

A newborn <u>calf, lamb</u> or <u>kid</u> must be left with its mother for seven days before being eligible for an offering; one may not slaughter an animal and its offspring on the same day. onspining of the same day.

The second part of Emor lists the annual Callings of Holiness—the festivals of the Jewish calendar: the weekly Shabbat; the bringing of the Passover offering on 14 Nissan; the seven-day Passover festival beginning on 15 Nissan; the bringing of the Omer offering from the first barley harvest on the second day of Passover, and the commencement, on that day, of the 49-day Counting of the Omer, culminating in the festival of Shavuot on the fiftieth day; a "remembrance of shofar blowing" on 1 Tishrei; a solemn fast day on 10 Tishrei; the Sukkot festival—during which we are to dwell in huts for seven days and take the "Four Kinds"—beginning on 15 Tishrei; and

the "Four Kinds"—beginning on 15 Tishrei; and the immediately following holiday of the "eighth day" of Sukkot (Shemini Atzeret). Next the Torah discusses the lighting of the menorah in the Temple, and the showbread (lechem hapanim) placed weekly on the table Emor concludes with the incident of a man executed for <u>blasphemy</u>, and the penalties for murder (death) and for injuring one's fellow or destroying his <u>property</u> (monetary compensation).
