As newspapers, websites and TV news stations blare the latest headlines of acts of terror and anti-Semitism being committed around the world - in the name of religion, no less - the depth of World Jewry's sense of identity, solidarity and resolve is being tested in ways that have not been seen in decades. Comes along this week's Torah portion Nasso, with a solution to such feelings of despair.

You see, it is so much easier to run away from life's challenges and the vicissitudes hurled at us. Sometimes for good reasons, it's so easy to feel faint hearted and ever so vulnerable. How can we possibly cope with our onslaught of problems?

In this week's Torah portion, after the Torah speaks of the suspected adulteress it begins the laws of the Nazarite. Why, the Talmud asks, is one topic juxtaposed next to the other? To which the Talmud answers when the Nazarite sees the tragic consequences of alcohol in the saga of the adulteress he then chooses to abstain from all contact with alcohol. His intentions seem so honorable and purely justified, but Maimonides asks an incredible question about his conduct. Why does this very holy motivated individual have to bring a sin offering when he finishes his term of Nazarite? To which Maimonides answers that G-d did not create a world for us to abstain from, but rather we need to elevate our environment. Of course it's easier to run away from the world but then we aren't being true to the reason that we were created. Unlike pain that is real, fear is something that we must work on overcoming and by taking on the day and giving it our best we will ultimately prevail. prevail.

Completing the <u>headcount</u> of the Children of Israel taken in the Sinai Desert, a total of 8,580 Levite men between the ages of 30 and 50 are counted in a tally of those who will be doing the actual <u>work</u> of <u>transporting</u> the <u>Tabernacle</u>.

G-d communicates to Moses the law of the sotah G-d communicates to Moses the law of the sotah, the <u>wayward wife</u> suspected of unfaithfulness to her husband. Also given is the law of the <u>nazir</u>, who forswears <u>wine</u>, lets his or her <u>hair</u> grow long, and is forbidden to become contaminated through <u>contact</u> with a dead body. Aaron and his descendants, the *kohanim*, are instructed on how to <u>bless</u> the people of Israel.

The leaders of the twelve tribes of Israel each bring their offerings for the <u>inauguration</u> of the altar. Although their gifts are <u>identical</u>, each is brought on a <u>different day</u> and is <u>individually</u> <u>described</u> by the Torah.
