Bal Shem Tov (also known as Moshiach's Meal) observing the conclusion of Passover

The last day of Passover ("Acharon Shel Pesach") is particularly associated with **Moshiach** and the future redemption. The Haftarah (reading from the Prophets) for this day is from Isaiah 11, which describes the promised future era of universal peace and divine perfection. Rabbi **Israel Baal Shem Tov** instituted the custom of partaking of a "Moshiach's meal" on the afternoon of the last day of Passover.

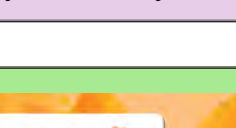
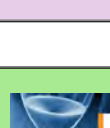


Volunteers needed to make LifeTown a success!

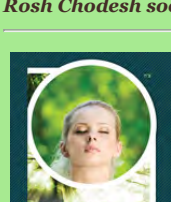
