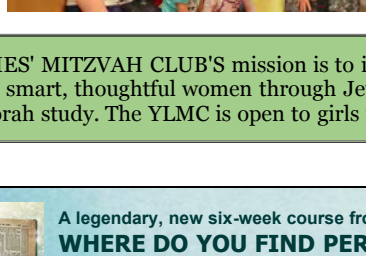


Women's Torah

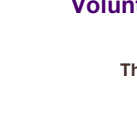
Monthly on Tuesdays - Next meeting May 7
