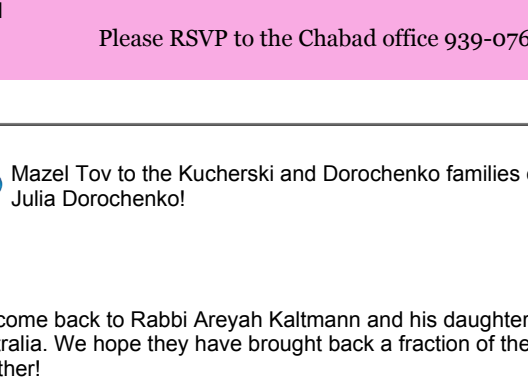

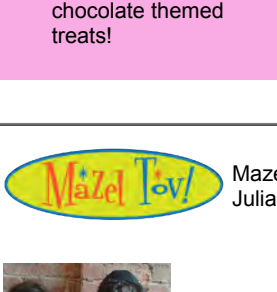

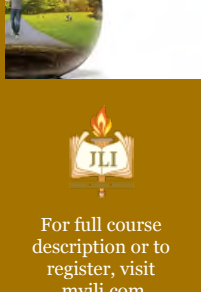
A Sweet Shabbat

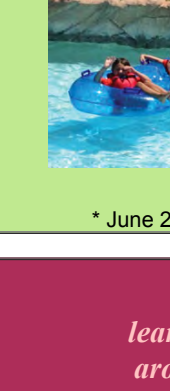

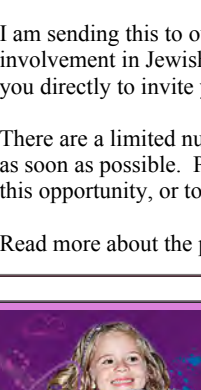
Kids Cook Up a Storm with Chabad's Little Chefs

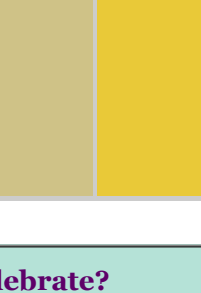

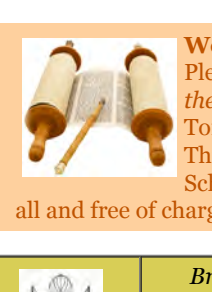
