A Tribute to my Bubby, Leah, daughter of Shlomo.

My Bubby arrived on the shores of the United States in 1937 with her only sister. She left behind her dear parents and fiance, my Zayde.

Though a series of miraculous events my Zayde made it to the US in 1941, on one of the last passenger ships to leave Europe.

She eagerly awaited her parents arrival on the SS St. Louis slated to dock on American shores. Unfortunately, as we all know the story, the ship was turned away and no country in the world would take them in except for Germany and my great-grand parents perished in Treblinka. For her entire life she cried for the loss of her parents.

My Bubby then waited for 4 years until my Zayde arrived so she could marry and build her own family anew.

At the same time she stood by my Zayde's side as a Rebbetzin in places such as Ballingham, Washington; Zanesville, Ohio; Daytona Beach, Florida and in New Britain, Connecticut where they served in the shul for over 50 years.

The ultimate wife and Woman of Valor, she was cared for my Zayde with utmost devotion, providing the healthiest diet imaginable and guarding her task with vigilance. Two years ago at a Hassidic wedding of one of her grandchildren she walked in and although the hall had a women's and men's side for the seating, she said, I cannot sit apart of Zayde, I have to watch what he eats. No one argued with my Bubby. She sat with him and that was that. I sat with them too and was amazed at their joy in being together. I would joke, perhaps Zayde would not mind sitting on the other side so he could eat some of the healthier yet delicious fare that seemed to be a fixture at Jewish weddings.

My earliest memories of Bubby were would come to help care for me and my siblings every time my mother had a child. Those who know my family, know how busy that must have kept her.

My grandparents were married for over 73 years and including their engagement/courtship, were a couple for 77 years and had met even 2 years before that. 79 years!

Together they built a generation of devoted Jews with 4 children, 38 grandchildren and hundreds of great and great great grandchildren.

Even for family-only events we needed to rent out a wedding hall.


My Bubby was a teacher, mother, grandmother, historian and a pillar of strength and dignity. She was a queen. The Hebrew word for queen, Malka is the numerical equivalent for 95, the age of my Bubby. How fitting.

Survived by my Zayde and her descendents, she will always be an everlasting role model and will remain a part of all of us.

May her soul be bound up with eternal life.






