Parshat Vayishlach

<u>Jacob</u> returns to the Holy Land after a 20-year stay in Charan, and sends angel-emissaries to <u>Esau</u> in hope of a reconciliation, but his messengers report that his brother is on the warpath with 400 armed men. Jacob prepares for <u>war</u>, <u>prays</u>, and sends Esau a large <u>gift</u> (consisting of hundreds of heads of livestock) to appease him.

That night, Jacob ferries his family and possessions across the Jabbok River; he, however, remains behind and encounters the angel that embodies <u>the spirit of Esau</u>, with when he were the until durback to check outforts. whom he wrestles until daybreak. Jacob suffers a dislocated hip but vanquishes the supernal creature, who bestows on him the name <u>Israel</u>, which means "he who prevails over the divine."

Jacob and Esau meet, embrace and kiss, but part ways. Jacob purchases a plot of land near <u>Shechem</u>, whose crown prince—also called Shechem—abducts and rapes Jacob's doughter Dinah's brothers Simeon and Levi Jacob's doughter Dinah's brothers Simeon and Levi average the deed by killing all male inhabitants of the city, after rendering them vulnerable by convincing them to circumcise themselves.

T772, and aniversary of the release from capital sentence and imprisonment of his disciple, Rabbi Shneur Zalman of Liadi, in 1798 and is celebrated as a Chassidic holiday amongst Chabad Chassidim.

Yud-Tes Kislev marks the "birth" of Chassidism: the day it was allowed to emerge from the womb of mysticism into the light of day, to grow and develop as an integral part of Torah and Jewish life.
